Introduction

MIRAI is a network for academic collaboration between Japanese and Swedish universities, which was launched in 2017. With the seven-year experience, the 3rd phase started in January 2024. The new phase is designed to engage researchers in a wide range of disciplines with social innovation and global challenges as common threads. MIRAI has newly defined the four prioritized challenges as follows.

- (1) Health and an ageing population (UN-SDG #3)
- (2) Climate adaptation, disaster and risk management and prevention (UN-SDG #13)
- (3) Resilient cities and communities (UN-SDG #11)
- (4) Materials for energy conversion and storage (UN-SDG #7)

MIRAI Global Challenges Winter School is an onsite program in the scope of the four global challenges and designed to attract early career researchers (ECRs) from diverse fields, including humanities and social sciences. This will be a platform where ECRs and various MIRAI stakeholders including universities and industry exchange ideas and thoughts, thereby linking participants in a multi-disciplinary way and leading to the development of the next-generation leaders.

The Sasakawa Networking conference on 20-22 November, hosted by EIJS as well, is a part of the program. Approximately 60-70 people from the Nordics (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden) and Japan are expected to join it. The conference will bring a great opportunity for MIRAI ECRs to do a networking, get experience, and meet other ECRs as well as senior researchers.

Program (Preliminary)

- The preliminary program for the winter school is as follows. Once fixed, the program will be shared with successful applicants later.
- The winter school is a 6-day program. For the last two days, participants are expected to join the conference “Contemporary Japanese Studies in the Nordics: Taking stock and looking forward” hosted by EIJS and granted by SJSF.

Eligibility

- PhD students or Postdocs in any discipline.
- Good motivation to communicate with other participants, expand your network and further contribute to MIRAI's other activities.
- Each MIRAI member university can nominate 1-2 person (s) with their internal selection process. More individual requirements might be set up by each university.

Costs for Participation

Expenses to be borne by the participants:

- Participation fee: 3,000 SEK (for meals and other costs related to the winter school and the conference)
 - Airfare (especially for participants from Japan): Between the nearest airport from your residence and Stockholm Arlanda Airport.
 - Other transportation fee
 - Travel insurance (if needed)
 - Passport and visa fees (if required)
 - Accommodation x 6 nights (Participants will be informed of SSE's partner hotel.)
