1. Course Overview

Kyushu University invites applications from PhD students to participate in the “**APRU FELLI Research-Intensive Field Course 2026**,” a field-based intensive course organized by the **Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU)**. The course is conducted as part of APRU’s **Forest Ecosystems Living Lab Initiative (FELLI)**, which brings together universities with research forests and experimental field sites across Asia, North America, and Latin America.

Through immersive fieldwork, participants will develop and apply **research design and implementation strategies** to address complex socio-ecological issues in real-world contexts. Key Features of the Course

- **An immersive field course across Ecuador’s diverse forest ecosystems**, including the Amazon region, cloud forests, and highland páramo ecosystems
- **Intensive training in research design for interdisciplinary and intercultural collaboration**, emphasizing critical thinking, reflexivity, and the appreciation of multiple perspectives
- **Hands-on experience with Living Lab-based research approaches**, designed for international collaborative research contexts
- **Long-term international research networking opportunities** with doctoral students and faculty members from APRU member universities

2. Course Schedule and Structure

Period and Format:

- **Online sessions:** July 20–23, 2026
- **On-site field course:** July 25–August 16, 2026

Location: Ecuador (various forest stations in the country)

Host Universities:

- Universidad San Francisco de Quito (Ecuador)
- The University of British Columbia (Canada)

3. Call for Applications from Kyushu University

Kyushu University strategically promotes the development of **globally engaged early career researchers (ECRs)** through international university consortia such as APRU. In line with this policy, Kyushu University will select **PhD students** to participate in this course as follows:

Number of Participants

- **Up to two (2) students**, selected through an internal screening process

Course Fee

- **USD 5,000 (approximately JPY 800,000)**

The course fee includes accommodation, meals, in-country transportation within Ecuador, and all field-course-related activities. Participants approved by APRU are required to pay a **deposit of USD 1,500 by May 18, 2026**. Please note that **international airfare between Japan and Ecuador**, travel insurance, and visa-related expenses are **not included** and must be covered by the participant.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be enrolled in a **doctoral program at Kyushu University** during the program period and as of **October 1, 2026**
- Have a strong interest in international and interdisciplinary research (Applicants from all academic fields are welcome, including—but not limited to—environmental studies, forestry, ecosystem science, social sciences, policy studies, community-based research, and comparative studies.)
- Demonstrate a high level of motivation to participate actively in **discussions, fieldwork**, and international research network building
- Be willing to contribute to broader **APRU-related academic activities**
- **Due to scheduling constraints, this second call is open only to applicants who do not require an entry visa to Ecuador.** Visa requirements by nationality can be checked [here](#) (Spanish only).

Financial Support for Outstanding Candidate

Based on the internal selection, **one (1) outstanding candidate** may receive **full financial support from Kyushu University for round-trip airfare between Japan and Ecuador**. This support may also include accommodation and per diem expenses required due to travel scheduling before or after the course period.

- Applicants receiving other scholarships must confirm in advance whether combined funding is permitted.
- Air tickets will be arranged by Kyushu University.
- Participants are required to enroll in designated overseas travel insurance and risk management services, and to complete Kyushu University's online risk management training prior to departure.
